It is required by the Diocese of Richmond for everyone to be installed (both experienced and new) as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion in their parish.



Directions & Parking:

To St. Thérèse, Chesapeake:

Arriving from the West by Interstate 64: at Hampton, take Interstate 664 South through the Monitor-Merrimack Memorial Bridge Tunnel. Take Exit 13B onto Portsmouth Boulevard.

Arriving from South Hampton Roads: Take Interstate 64 or 264 West to Interstate 664 North. Take Exit 13B onto Portsmouth Boulevard.

After the third stoplight, turn right into the church. The parking lot is at the front of the church, which faces away from Portsmouth Boulevard.

To St. Andrew, Chincoteague Island:

Arriving from South Hampton Roads: Take the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel (US 13N). On the Eastern Shore, US-13 N becomes Charles M. Lankford Jr. Memorial Highway. Drive 28 miles, and turn right onto Chincoteague Rd. (VA 175). Drive 10.5 miles, and turn left onto North Main Street, then right onto Mumford Street.
