



The Saint Anne Medal

An Adult Religious Recognition

The Saint Anne Medal is for adults working with Catholic members of national organizations serving girls. The medal was inaugurated at the Sixth National Conference on Catholic Youth Work in Philadelphia in November 1957. It was redesigned in 1980. The Saint Anne Medal is offered to those dioceses, which choose to use it, subject to the approval of the local ordinary. It is the highest national award in this field. The purpose of the medal is to honor the outstanding service to adults contributing to the spiritual development of Catholic members of girl's organizations, and to further Catholic adult leadership in youth ministry through organizations serving girls.

Selection Process and Diocesan Contact

Nominations and recommendations may be made by anyone, using the attached form. People who were nominated in a previous year but were not selected may be renominated if still eligible.

Nomination deadline is the 31st of December for presentation at the March Diocesan Scouting Liturgy with Bishop Sullivan. Awards made outside of this schedule must have correspondence detailing the need for special consideration.
